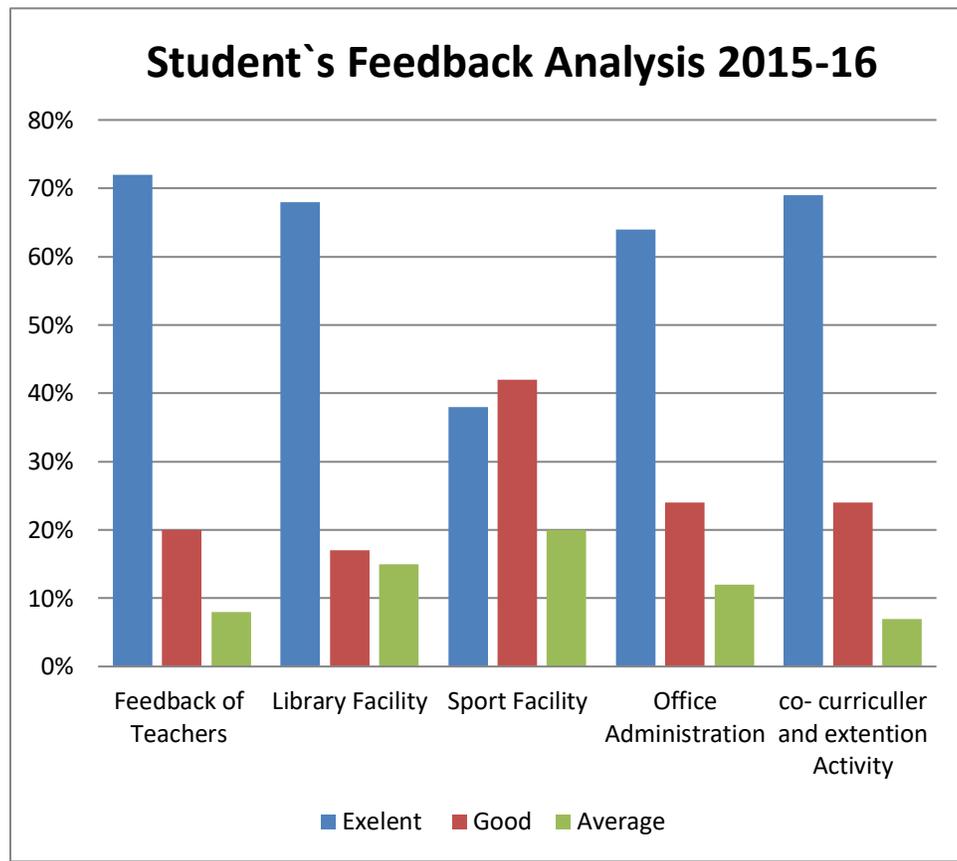

#### **Best Practice No. 1**
